Introduction of Program:

Flood Victim Support Program was conducted in co-operation with **Drei Konigs Aktion, Austria** and **Society for Environment Education Development (SEED), Nepal** for Flood affected Victims due to heavy rainfall in Nepal from 11th to 14th August 2017. This support program was provided for the flood victim families who live under the working areas of SEED, Dang. The flood affected area includes three working VDC's of SEED (*Phoolbari VDC, Goltakuri VDC and Urahari VDC*) where recently due to new administrative division of Nepal, these VDC's lie in the *Tulsipur Sub-Metropolitan City ward no. 11 and 13 for Urahari and Phoolbari VDC respectively and Dangisaran Ward's ward no. 1 and 2 for Goltakuri VDC*. These areas were completely destroyed by the flood. These flood victims were provided support

on the primary basis of survey in direct presence of flood affected families who were totally destroyed by flood analyzing their status.

Flood has affected more than 161 households. Out of 161 flood affected households 61 household families from Poor and Dalit categories who were completely destroyed by flood were provided instant support of daily consumable food grains and tarpaulin/tent materials for instant relief to minimize their daily problems. It was difficult for completely affected households to have enough meals for the whole day after flood. Concerning to this situation and at the same time as Nepali festival Dashain and Tihar was commencing, so with a view not to lack flood affected households from daily consumable goods in this auspicious time, make them easy to celebrate the festival and keep all affected households happy Flood relief materials were distributed. Similarly, with an objective to send school children continuously to school 78 school children who were directly affected from flood were provided with education materials as well. This “Flood Relief Program” was conducted in coordination and cooperation with local agencies main representatives for the support and help of completely flood affected victims.

Program Objective:

- ❖ Re-establishment of flood affected victim communities’ households from natural disasters.
- ❖ To develop social and hearty feeling’s with the direct flood affected victims.
- ❖ To help flood victims by providing instant necessary foods, tarpaulin/tents and education materials.
- ❖ To alert people about natural phenomena’s pre-preparation.

Relief Distribution Activities:

- ❖ To study baseline of totally affected flood victims household.
- ❖ To manage foods and education materials to distribute flood affected victims.
- ❖ To select flood affected household families and children for food and education materials distribution.
- ❖ To study recommended documents from concerned local bodies with their coordination, support and in being touch with them about flood affected victims.
- ❖ To provide relief (flood relief materials) for the flood affected victims in presence of local representatives.

Coverage Area:

Coverage area includes three working VDC’s of SEED namely, **Phoolbari VDC, Urahari VDC and Goltakuri VDC**. These VDC’s after administrative division recently falls under Tulsipur Sub metropolitan City ward no. 11 and 13 for the Urahari and Phoolbari VDC respectively and as a Dangisaran Ward ward no. 1 and 2 for the Goltakuri VDC.

Beneficiary Group:

Beneficiary group includes Tharu, Dalit, Women and Children from fully and partially flood affected communities' staying in the working areas of SEED.

Co-ordination and Cooperation with local agencies:

- ❖ Tulipur Sub Metropolitan City.
- ❖ Dangisaran Ward.
- ❖ Nepali Police Security Office.
- ❖ Concerned ward's local representative.
- ❖ Local committee's relief distribution representatives.
- ❖ Concerned flood affected areas community schools.
- ❖ Other social associations and district natural phenomenon etc.

Basis of flood affected families' selection process:

- ❖ By collecting information and location study.
- ❖ By visiting and having discussion with concerned flood affected victims.
- ❖ By sharing information in co-ordination and cooperation with the concerned ward offices.
- ❖ In coordination with local security agencies and sharing information.
- ❖ In co-ordination with local relief distribution committees.
- ❖ In cooperation, coordination and information sharing with local associations.
- ❖ Having discussion with human right workers and civil societies.
- ❖ Concerning and co-coordinating with local police in charge for security and information sharing.
- ❖ On the basis of recommendation provided by the school for the school children studying there.
- ❖ In taking recommendation and permission from the Tulipur Sub-metropolitan City and Dangisaran Ward.
- ❖ Through the suggestions and consultancy with SEED organizations donor partners.

Food items and materials distribution procedure and process for flood affected families:

- ❖ Flood affected families were selected on the basis of true data and information collection.
- ❖ Definite time frame and information flow for everyone's participation.
- ❖ In presence of Tulsipur Sub-Metropolitan city and Dangisharan Local body.
- ❖ In presence of local relief distribution committee and security agencies.
- ❖ In participation of different social institutions, press and direct flood affected households.

Educational materials distribution process and procedure:

- ❖ By coordinating and cooperating with school where flood affected household's children studies.
- ❖ Having discussion with concerned flood affected children and school.
- ❖ Information collection of actual flood affected children.
- ❖ Recommendation letter for each flood affected children from their respective school was requested.
- ❖ Necessary educational materials were collected and were distributed on reaching to respective school.
- ❖ Relief materials to flood affected children were distributed in presence with school principal, school management committee, teachers and direct presence of school children.

Flood affected victim's direct request and statements:

- ❖ Yearly flood comes in the canals/rivers and we have to live like a flood victims. We hope for safe place to stay and build a strong house. (**By- Mr. Ram Bahadur Damai**)
- ❖ Flood took our house. We are compelled to stay in others house. We would have lived making house if we have received tarpaulin/tent support. (**By- Mr. Bhola Prasad B.K**)
- ❖ It would be good if secure place to live and food were been managed. (**By- Ramesh B.K**)
- ❖ Our children do not have school dress and stationeries to go to school. We have food and staying problem. We are trying to manage it. (**By- Mr. Sanjay B.K**)
- ❖ Our houses have been destroyed by flood and rainfall but local representatives have not paid any interest towards it. (**By- Man Bahadur Nepali**)
- ❖ We have not expected flood would come and carry our all houses and livestock's. But, saddest thing is that even local bodies have not given any attention towards food and clothing in this difficult situation. (**By- Mr. Nar Bahadur B.K**)
- ❖ We have not cleared loans of first house and that house is also taken by flood. Now how to build another house. It's our deep appeal to all social institutions and organizations please support us as possible. (**By- Mrs. Subitra Damai**)

Stakeholder's statements:

- ❖ We are making necessary management process for construction of secure houses. (**Mr. Madhu Khadka- ward secretary**)
- ❖ We are working on recommendation of fully destroyed houses by collecting data's. (**Mr. Dambar Neupane- Warda Chairman**)
- ❖ All flood affected households should unite together. We are working in solving your long term problem. (**Mr. Kabiraj Acharya- Citizen good governance- Tulsipur sub metropolitan city**)
- ❖ We are working in bringing uniformity for relief distribution. (**Mr. Tulsipram Devkota- Ward Chairman**)

Programs results/outcomes:

- ❖ 61 poor people of working areas from Tharu and Dalit communities received flood victim support.
- ❖ Flood affected victims expressed their big happiness after getting available food items and materials.
- ❖ Every flood affected families are able to live together making house/tents from tarpaulin being safe from rain, sun and cold.
- ❖ 78 school children from flood affected children after receiving educational materials are able to continue their school.
- ❖ Natural phenomenon rehabilitation committee has been locally established.

Problems and challenges:

- ❖ All fully and partially destroyed flood affected household's have expectation towards relief.
- ❖ Non uniform information about actual flood victims at local level.
- ❖ Irresponsibility of local level representatives towards flood victims problem and questionnaire.
- ❖ Use of politics towards flood victim families in flood affected areas.
- ❖ Unjustifiable process in distribution of flood relief food materials.
- ❖ Nation in state of being silence and watcher only.

Learning:

First, on knowing the necessary materials required for the flood affected families we should force local level to support them. Secondly, we should make local level representatives more responsible towards flood victim families problems and questions. Thirdly, only flood victim families would get actual justice and peace in their heart only when they are provided with instant relief of foods and required materials on the basis of their damages or lost they suffered from natural calamities.

Organization recommendation:

- ❖ We have to identify the secure place to live for the fully affected poor household families flood victims.
- ❖ It has become of greater importance that at least flood affected poor people from Tharu and Dalit community should construct concrete houses of two rooms.
- ❖ It is instant necessity that flood affected victims should be provided with warm clothes to be saved from cold during winter season.
- ❖ It is important to bring skill development training and income generating programs for flood affected victims.
- ❖ It is important to make people aware and pre-preparation about natural calamities and disasters.

Conclusion:

Flood affected victims from the working areas of SEED are forced to live making tents under the open sky and public places. They don't have sufficient daily consumable goods like rice, pulses, oil, salts, tarpaulin etc. because of which they are struggling hard to sustain their daily needs. It has even proved that natural calamities also occur only in the households of poor and pity people. It has also been equal responsibilities of Nepali Government, International Donor Agencies, Human Right Workers and Social institutions for the sustainable management and solution of these flood affected household families. So, for their sustainable and managed livelihood and in order to bring economical, social and educational improvements, it is necessary to play important role from all of us.
